

Minutes of 44th Meeting of the Authority held on 22.04.2022 at 03:15 P.M. in the Committee Room under the Chairmanship of Sh. Karan Avtar Singh, Chairperson PWRDA.

Present: Sh. Sushil Gupta Member & Dr. Surinder Singh Kukal Member.

In attendance: Mr. J K Jain Additional Secretary, Mr. Maninder Singh XEN and Mr. Inderpreet Singh, SDO.

Item No.44.01: Confirmation of the Minutes of 43rd Meeting of PWRDA.

a. The minutes of 43rd meeting were emailed on 13.04.2022 to all concerned. During discussion on Item No. 43.07, it was decided to fix monthly remuneration for the post of Technical Manager (Agriculture) @ Rs. 50,000/- . However, due to inadvertent oversight error this fact could not be reflected in the decision recorded and circulated. It is proposed that at the end of the decision of item no. 43.07 the following may be added:

“The remuneration for the post of Technical Manager (Agriculture) shall be Rs 50,000/- per month.

b. The Agenda item 43.10 was taken up and following decision was recorded:

“Decision: Being issued separately.”

But it was not issued as it required further discussion on some of the points. Therefore, the decision for item number: 43.10 may be recorded as *“Deferred for further discussion.”*

The Minutes of 43rd Meeting may be confirmed with the above modifications as no comments received on any other item.

Decision: Approved as proposed.

Item No. 44.02: Action Taken Report:

Action taken report will be put up in next meeting.

Decision: Noted.

Item No. 44.03: Water Conservation in Agriculture.

The groundwater resource has been depleting in majority of blocks in Punjab with 117 blocks out of total 150 blocks being categorized as over-exploited. The groundwater situation based on stage of development and depletion rate is most grim in district Sangrur. It is mainly due to higher proportion of paddy area under long duration cultivars coupled with non-judicious use of irrigation water.

1. Proposal for Pilot Project on ‘Water Conservation in Paddy in Sunam and Dhuri blocks of district Sangrur’

Replacing long duration paddy cultivars with short duration paddy cultivars could result in saving of about 25-30% irrigation water in paddy cultivation. This water saving could be increased if transplanting of paddy is delayed to coincide with the onset of rainy season.

Based on the stage of groundwater development in district Sangrur, it was observed that Dhuri and Sunam blocks (attached as **Annexure A1**) are the most affected with respect to groundwater depletion. Hence, these two blocks were selected for water conservation in paddy on pilot basis.

Purpose of Pilot Project: A pilot project is being proposed to be undertaken in clusters of 50 acre (each) or more in these blocks so as to ascertain the impact of short duration paddy cultivars on water consumption, coupled with delayed transplanting. Secondly, this pilot project aims to demonstrate to farmers whether water saving in paddy can be achieved without reducing crop yield.

The following project is being proposed on pilot basis in district Sangrur for water conservation in paddy.

Scheme 1: Sowing of short duration cultivars of paddy (PR126) coupled with delayed transplanting (by at least 10 days)

Number of blocks	:	2 (Sunam & Dhuri)
Number of villages	:	26 (Sunam #14 , Dhuri #12)

2. Proposal for Pilot Project on ‘Replacing Paddy with Cotton in district SAS Nagar’

Replacing paddy crop with cotton could result in huge saving of irrigation water, as the cotton crop requires only one fourth of irrigation water as compared to paddy.

Purpose of Pilot Project: The pilot project is being proposed to be undertaken in Majri and Kharar block of district SAS Nagar (attached as **Annexure A2**) so as to reduce the extraction of huge amounts of groundwater. Secondly, this pilot project aims to demonstrate to the farmers the huge saving of groundwater with equivalent or higher returns, in an area which is suitable for growing cotton but where cotton is no longer grown.

The following conservation scheme is proposed for crop diversification in SAS Nagar:

Replacing paddy with cotton in Majri and Kharar blocks of SAS Nagar district

Number of blocks	:	02 (Majri & Kharar)
Number of villages	:	32 (Block Majri #19, Block Kharar #13)
Number of beneficiaries	:	85 (Block Majri #50, Block Kharar #35)
Number of clusters	:	06 (Block Majri #05, Block Kharar #01)
Area under each cluster	:	50 acres
Total area covered	:	300 acres
Expected saving of water	:	1.08 Million Cubic Metres
Estimated expenditure	:	Rs 4.92lakh (for BT Cotton Seed @Rs. 1640/- per acre)

Placed before the Authority for consideration.

Decision:

Authority considered the recommendations of the Committee, the costs and benefits (water conservation) of the proposed pilot projects and decided as follows:

1. *Approved the pilot project for sowing of short duration cultivars of paddy (PR126) coupled with delayed transplanting (by at least 10 days) in 37 selected clusters measuring about 1672 acres in blocks Sunam and Dhuri, District Sangrur; and*

a) *Approved a grant of Rs 6.70 lakh out of the Authority Fund for free of cost supply of 134 quintal PR126 variety paddy seed @ about Rs 400/- per acre to the farmers.*

b) *Approved installation of up to 100 water flow measuring devices on the tube wells of the farmers, considering that a maximum of 100 farmers in block Sunam and Dhuri may voluntarily agree to install water flow measuring devices on their tube wells. The cost of procurement and installation of these water flow measuring devices shall be borne by the PWRDA.*

c) *Water conservation credits will be given to such farmers who voluntarily install water flow measuring device @ Rs. 2.00 per cubic meter of water saved based on bench mark recommended by the Committee with an upper cap.*

d) *The location and number of the piezometers required will be recommended by the Committee keeping in view the number and location of observation wells and piezometers already installed in each block by State Government or CGWA. Approved in principle the installation of up to 10 piezometers, 5 in each block Sunam & Dhuri of Distt Sangrur.*

e) *The cost of these piezometers including installation, maintenance and repairs shall be borne by the Authority.*

2. *Approved the proposal submitted by the Committee for sowing cotton in Majri and Kharar blocks of SAS Nagar district; and*

a) *Approved a Grant amounting to Rs 4.92 lakh for free of cost supply of 600 packs of BT Cotton seed @ Rs 1640 per acre to the farmers.*

b) *Approved installation of up to 30 water flow measuring devices on the tube wells of the farmers of block Majri and Kharar of Distt Mohali, considering that a maximum of 30 farmers may agree voluntarily to install these devices on their tube wells.*

3. *Approved a pilot project replacing paddy with cotton in the following three blocks:*

i. *Bhagta Bhai ka (Distt Bathinda).*

ii. *Sehna (Distt Barnala)*

iii. *Nihal Singh Wala (Distt Moga)*

Each block may have a pilot project covering an area of about 300 acres. In these blocks, the farmers

who opt for this pilot project shall be given the following benefits:

- a) Free of cost supply of BT cotton seed @ Rs. 1640/- per acre to the farmers.*
 - b) The water flow measuring devices shall be installed free of cost on the tube wells of such farmers who voluntarily agree to installation of water flow measuring devices.*
 - c) Water conservation credits will be given to the farmers who voluntarily install water measuring devices on their tube wells. The rate of water conservation credit will be @ Rs. 2 per cubic meter of water saved based on bench mark recommended by the Committee with an upper cap.*
- 4. The Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Punjab will submit a proposal based on the estimated cost involved for purchase and installation of up to 130 no. of water flow measuring devices and up to 10 no. of piezometers to the Authority for pilot projects at serial 1 and 2 above, and shall also prepare a cost estimate for the pilot projects at serial 3 above.*
 - 5. The Implementing Agency for these Pilot Projects will be Director Agriculture & Farmers Welfare Punjab, who will get these projects executed through the Chief Agriculture Officer of the respective District.*
 - 6. The funds will be released to the Director Agriculture & Farmers Welfare Punjab based on requisitions received. Secretary, PWRDA is authorized to release the funds for these Pilot Projects as approved above, to the Director Agriculture & Farmers Welfare Punjab.*
 - 7. The Director Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Punjab shall submit a Utilization Certificate of the grants within ninety days from the date of receipt of the funds along with a comprehensive report on the water saving achieved through the above Pilot Projects.*

Item No. 44.04: Clarification regarding payment of groundwater extraction charges under Draft Guidelines 2020 and Directions 2022.

This item was earlier discussed in 42nd and 43rd Meetings of the Authority but it was deferred for further deliberations.

It is resubmitted with some changes as a fresh item as under:

1. EMAAR India Limited applied for Ad-Interim permission for Extraction of Groundwater under Draft Guidelines, 2020. In column 8(c) of the application form, type of Unit was mentioned as **“Infrastructure” (application form attached as Annexure A3)**. Accordingly, ad interim permission was granted for the extraction of 234695 cubic meter of Groundwater per annum as applied for.
2. The applicant deposited two months groundwater charges as security deposit and tube-well registration fee total amounting to Rs 24,81,200/- along with the application. The permission holder vide representation dated 23.02.2022 submitted that:

“We have obtained permission for ground water extraction vide your letter dated 19.01.2022 (Copy enclosed) for our Integrated

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Township “Mohali Hills”. As per permission, we need to pay PWRDA @ Rs. 18/KL for water consumed for domestic & drinking purposes. We intend to charge the same to the residents. The residents are quoting clause No. 5.1 of the Draft Guidelines (Page 22 of 50) that states that drinking and domestic usage is exempted from seeking permission ground water extraction, hence not liable to pay any ground water extraction charges.

There is also negative media report (enclosed) that states we intend to illegally charge the residents for domestic/drinking water that is free of cost as per PWRDA.

Would request you to kindly confirm whether we are exempted from paying ground water extraction charges for domestic and drinking usage. We will submit the monthly charges upon confirmation from your side.”

3. Regarding extraction and use of groundwater for drinking and domestic purposes, the various provisions in Punjab Water Resources (Management and Regulation) Act, 2020 are reproduced below:

- a. Section 15(2): The Authority may issue directions regarding the development management, or use of water which may include the following namely:

“...Provided that no directions shall be issued for extraction of water for drinking and domestic use.”

- b. Section 16 of the Act says that:

“Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 14-15 of this Act, the Authority shall not impose any ban on Extraction of Groundwater for drinking or domestic User”.

- c. Sub-section 5 of Section 17 of the Act reads as under:

“(5) The Authority may with the approval of the Government, fix charges for extraction of groundwater by any person but no charges shall be levied on extraction of water by households drawing water for their own drinking and domestic purpose through non-energized means or through a pump up to 2Horse Power from a single tube-well in the household where common piped water supply is not available.”

4. The relevant provision in draft Guidelines is as under:

“5.1 EXEMPTIONS FROM SEEKING PERMISSION

- a. The following categories of uses shall be exempted from seeking permission for groundwater extraction and conservation:

- i. Drinking and Domestic water usage;

ii. *All Agricultural water usage, that is water used for any activities included in the definition of 'Agriculture and related activities' by the Government.;*

b. *The following categories of water users shall be exempted from seeking permission for groundwater extraction and conservation:*

i. *Drinking Water Supply schemes of Government, whether managed or operated by Government or by any other person including a water users' association;*

ii. *Establishments for the Military and Central Paramilitary Forces;*

iii. *Urban Local Bodies and Panchayati Raj Institutions, Improvement Trusts and Area Housing and Urban Development Authorities; and Places of Worship.*

Note: *It is clarified that all other categories of water usage and water users including industrial, commercial, infrastructure, institutional, construction and mining shall require permission for groundwater extraction and conservation."*

5. Further under the category "Infrastructure", 53 Ad-Interim Permissions for Extraction of Groundwater have been granted so far. All of them have paid advance security deposit for two months and requisite other fees.
6. Scrutiny of their applications shows that in column 7(d) under head "groundwater extraction requirement details", they have shown entire groundwater requirement under the head drinking and domestic/green belt/others.
7. As per the provisions contained in Para 5.1 of the Draft Guidelines, Extraction of Groundwater for drinking and domestic use falls under exempted category. Whereas, Section 17(5) of the Act says that "households drawing water for their own drinking and domestic purpose through non-energized means or through a pump up to 2 Horse Power from a single tube-well in the household where common piped water supply is not available" are exempted from groundwater charges.
8. Since the Directions must comply with the provisions of the Act, the above exemption in section 17 (5) of the Act may be specifically mentioned in the Directions. Accordingly, the following amendments in the Directions are proposed:

9. Department of Local Government, Punjab vide notification dated 21.10.2021(**Annexure A4**) and PUDA vide notification dated 10.11.2021 (**Annexure A5**) had fixed a flat rate for supply of Water for Domestic and Drinking use @ Rs 50



per month for all categories of plot size above 125 sq. yard and plot size below 125 sq. yard is exempted.

The groundwater extraction charges proposed in the Directions, as approved by the State Government under Section 17(5) are as follows:

Units are eligible for certain water conservation credits (rebate) if they implement approved water conservation schemes.

Consequent to the amendment proposed in paragraph 8 above, and to ensure that the provisions of section 17(5) quoted in that paragraph are implemented without any ambiguity or doubt as expressed in the representation mentioned in paragraph 2 above, the Authority may consider making an appropriate reference, or explanation for exemption with respect to groundwater charges for group housing, residential apartments and residential colonies, where groundwater water is extracted and used for several (mixed) purposes including drinking and domestic use.

For this purpose the definition of group housing, residential apartments, residential colonies etc. needs to be determined. An example from the PAPRA Act is at Annexure A7.

In case any changes in rates of groundwater charges already approved by Government are proposed, then those would require the fresh approval of Government under section 17(5).

10. The relevant provision of CGWA Guidelines dated 24 September 2020 for abstraction charges imposed on Drinking and domestic use for residential apartments/ group housing societies/ Government water supply agencies in Urban areas is Annexed as **Annexure A6** for reference please.
11. The following provisions contained in sub section (3) to (5) of Section 15 of the Punjab Water Resources (Management and Regulation) Act, 2020 dealing with issuance of Directions are reproduced below:
12. *“(3) No direction(s) issued by the Authority under sub-section (2) shall come into force unless a notice in this regard is published in not less than two newspapers, including*

at least one daily regional language newspaper having wide circulation in the State.

(4) Any person may file written objection(s) against the proposed Direction(s) along with such fee, as may be specified, within one month from the date of its publication.

(5) The Authority shall consider and settle all objections received against such direction(s) expeditiously and notify the final directions on such date, as it may deem fit”

13. Accordingly, Authority may decide on the following:

- a. Amendment in the Directions, 2022 as proposed in paragraph 8 herein above.
- b. Define “Group Housing/Residential Apartments/Residential Colonies etc.”. For reference, the relevant definitions given in the PAPRA Act 1995 are at **Annexure A7**.
- c. Determine or clarify the applicability of groundwater charges for Group Housing/Residential Apartments/Residential Colonies etc. in view of the facts mentioned in paragraph 9 above.
- d. Apply these amendments, definitions and clarifications in an appropriate manner to the ad-interim permissions granted under the Draft Guidelines so that the issues raised in the representation are addressed and settled.

Placed before the Authority for decision.

Decision: 1. The following amendments are made in the Directions:

a. *In chapter 2 the following be added in the definitions:*

“building” means a building constructed on any land, containing eleven or more apartments, or two or more buildings with a total of eleven or more apartments, or any existing building converted into eleven or more apartments;

“colony” means an area of land not less than one thousand square meters divided or proposed to be divided into plots for residential, commercial or industrial purpose;

Note: A User in the context of Unit consisting of a Building or a Colony shall include a Builder, Developer, Coloniser, Owner, Allottee, Group Housing Society, Special Purpose Vehicle or Residents’ Welfare Association as the case may be; and

b. *In Chapter 3 the explanation in para 3.1 (i) be replaced with the following explanation and be added after 3.1 (vii):*

Explanation:

An individual household shall be exempted under this clause only if it extracts groundwater exclusively for drinking and domestic use through non-energised means or through a pump of up to 2 HP capacity from a single tube-well in the household.

c. *In Chapter 5 “GROUNDWATER CHARGES” the following be added:*



5.1 GROUNDWATER CHARGES

A. but no charges shall be levied on extraction of ground water by an individual household exclusively for drinking and domestic use through non-energised means or through a pump of up to 2 HP capacity from a single tube-well in the household.

B. That where a Unit in the context of a Building or a Colony, extracts Ground Water for drinking and domestic use, then, such Unit shall be eligible for exemption of Ground Water Extraction Charges up to 30 Cubic Meters for each occupied individual household/dwelling unit/apartment per month in such building or colony.

Explanation: A dwelling Unit shall be considered to be Occupied only after the User submits a Completion Certificate issued by the competent Authority.

C. If such Unit extracts groundwater in excess of the exempted volume in any month, it shall pay Groundwater Extraction Charges for that excess volume of Groundwater Extracted for that month at the rate equal to the slab rate detailed in Table 5.1 corresponding to the Assessment Area (Block) where such a Unit is located.

- 2. Chairperson is authorised to amend the Application Form accordingly.*
- 3. The representation contained in this Agenda Item is hereby decided in terms of the decisions taken above. This decision shall apply to all applications received for this purpose for Ad-interim Permission i.e. to all such Units which have already been granted or may be granted ad-interim Permission under the Draft Guidelines, 2020.*
- 4. Consequently, excess payment of Security Deposit received from any User who has already been granted or may be granted ad-interim Permissions, falling under fully exempted category, shall be returned.*
